RE: Proposed Development of Sand and Gravel Quarry at Leathersley Lane, Sudbury, Derbyshire

I am writing on behalf of Cemex to invite you to an in person or virtual meeting with the project team, ahead of an upcoming public consultation for proposals to develop a new sand and gravel quarry at land off Leathersley Lane, Sudbury, Derbyshire.

Cemex is a leading global producer and marketer of cement, concrete and other building materials. The proposed new quarry, located on a 68.7-hectare site south of Leathersley Lane has been strategically chosen due to the significant sand and gravel deposits it contains, meeting the demand as set out by Derbyshire County Council and Derby City Council within the emerging Derbyshire and Derby Minerals Local Plan.

The proposed development involves extracting approximately 2.1 million tonnes of sand and gravel and progressively restoring the site over a 6-year period, followed by another 5-year period of further progressive restoration.

Key points of the proposal include:

- The quarry operations will be phased to minimise environmental impacts and ensure efficient use of resources, featuring state-of-the-art processing facilities for washing and stockpiling the extracted materials.
- Entrance will be via an upgraded existing farm access off Leathersley Lane, minimising disruption to the surrounding area, site vehicles will not pass through the village of Scropton.
- The project will provide substantial economic benefits, including job creation and support for local businesses, contributing significantly to Derbyshire's construction industry.
- The site will be progressively restored using approximately 1.4 million tonnes of inert restoration material, enhancing agricultural potential and biodiversity while creating habitats that support local wildlife and improving the local landscape, with restoration continuing for 5 years post-quarrying.

Cemex is committed to sustainability, with the quarry's operations aligning with its "Future in Action" programme, aiming to reduce carbon emissions and promoting a circular economy. Cemex's goal is to build long-term relationships with the communities within which they operate, ensuring openness and transparency at all stages of the proposals.

Cemex is currently in the process of preparing a planning application, which will be submitted alongside an Environmental Impact Assessment, addressing impacts on ecology, landscape, noise, dust, transport, heritage, flood risk, hydrogeology, and soils. The aim is that the planning application is submitted in the next few months and subject to approval they expect quarrying operations to begin no earlier than Mid 2027.

Due to your important role in the local community, Cemex is keen to discuss the plans with you ahead of the application submission. We hope that by discussing the proposals with you now, the submitted planning application will better reflect the needs of the local community and have already addressed residents' concerns.
